## NEOBC Launches Online Classes

Northeast Ohio Bible College, working with the Nation Network of Digital Schools (NNDS) – a subsidiary of the Pennsylvania Cyber Charter School, is launching online classes. These classes were advertised in the recent 2011 fall schedule. Beginning in the fall of 2012, Northeast Ohio Bible College will have a complete freshman year on the schedule. The cost is only \$80 per hour for both credit and audit courses.

The courses available at Northeast Ohio Bible College will increase each year, building on the previous year's courses. For example, the freshman year commencing in the fall of 2012 will be followed by the sophomore year in 2013, offering a new full course load. The junior year in 2014 will then offer a new full course load, followed by the senior year in 2015 with new courses. Each subsequent year, we will offer all of the previous courses and a new full course load.

Online classes enable working students or those with other scheduling conflicts to take the class at their convenience. Students who are available to attend the class can enjoy it live, of course. The church should use this opportunity to educate itself concerning the work of Christ.

Any class may be audited, meaning students may take the class in order to gain the knowledge, but they do not have to do the homework if they are too busy. Doing the homework, reading the textbook, and keeping up with the text in the Bible always increases one's knowledge, but if one is too busy, at least some knowledge is gained through listening to the lectures and class discussions.

Northeast Ohio Bible College invites everyone to take advantage of the online classes and of the opportunity to earn a Biblical education while remaining at home.

## A Note of Explanation: The College Finances

Northeast Ohio Bible College recently received a check in the amount of approximately \$32,000 for leasing the gas rights underneath the property. The amount was deposited into the building fund, but the majority will be spent on helping to develop ONLINE CLASSES.

Also, please note that the general fund is quite large at present. Northeast Ohio Bible College has been requesting (and continues to request)

funds for several projects, and the money received is being deposited in the general fund.

The necessary projects include purchasing a new commercial mower, and replacing the entire roof on the college building. The roof has already sprung several leaks. Additionally, the furnaces that heat the entire building, auditorium, classrooms and administration



offices need to be replaced, and the cost is approximately \$28,000. The furnaces have been inspected by a reputable company and will soon need to be replaced.

One may observe, therefore, that both accounts are quite large.

However, Northeast Ohio Bible College is continuing to request donations in order to avoid borrowing funds to complete these projects. Please make Northeast Ohio Bible College and these necessary projects a matter of prayer at your congregation.
